  - Fundraiser May 3rd John Gorka
  - September Federal Judge John Tunheim has a house on Judd Street
- Potential equipment acquisitions Jim
  - Matt Quast a sound engineer by trade, chief AV guy on the programs committee, has brought in a couple of big sound speakers; he is thinking of donating them to the library; Jim will present this idea to the council and the restoration society
  - We continue to look at ways to accomplish acoustic balancing in the upstairs as sound bounces around a lot
  - Update on countertops project Jeff Black will be working on them later this week; Restoration Society and the City have both approved our plans
- Art
  - current art comes down the end of February. Tammy will let us know who is next
- Children's Programing Christine
  - Summer camps, summer kickoff, family game night, storytime, summer reading incentive program – all are again on for this year.
  - Summer camps again filled up on Day One. Area businesses are again generous with their donations to the reading incentive program.

- Summer program Kickoff is Saturday, June 13<sup>th</sup> at the Gazebo Park
- Collections Beth & Jim
  - Craig Blacklock book, St. Croix & Namekagon Rivers The Enduring Gift
    - Craig Blacklock wrote Anne Reich offering the library a museum copy of his St. Croix and Namekagen book. He received a donation to fund the purchase of ten of these books (retail value \$1500) for various libraries, and picked ours as one of them. We graciously accepted the offer.
    - Would like to have it displayed in the Library but also want to protect the book. One idea is to have a glass display space where it can be permanently displayed. Volunteers could change the page each day. Jim is going to talk with Jeff Black about the potential of building such a case.
    - If the book is kept on display where people can turn pages, need to have some way of protecting the pages. Finger guards or something similar.
    - The book also came with three large St. Croix River/Namekagon River prints. We could have them framed for \$200 and then display them – perhaps upstairs (will check with the Restoration Society); may also choose to auction them off.
    - 30-35 new books have been bought since October
    - pop up book sale in December yielded \$30
    - donations policy books donated must be year 2017 or newer
    - The Big Read (NEA) is coming up in April; they give us multiple copies of the book each year; this year it is *Lab Girls*
  - <u>Communications</u> Loralee
    - Loralee and Anne Reich are the two members. They would really appreciate having a third member. Elaine Larson agreed to be that member.
  - <u>Fundraising</u> Mary Burke
    - Oscar Night summary

- Went really well. Expanded seating; 88 tickets sold out. Committee this year did an exceptional job with decorations.
- A lot of effort but committee agreed it was well worth it.
- Plan to continue with the same basic format next year
- John Gorka concert May 3 Mary Burke is coordinating and reporting
  - Nationally known folk musician; doing our event pro bono.
  - Lives in May Township; could only do the event in the spring, hence we moved the annual fundraiser to springtime. 7:00 performance
  - Need to do PR, food and beverages, wine will be sold; liquor license needed; hall is booked with Lynnette;
  - Tickets will be \$40
  - Mary would like additional volunteers to work with her on this event.

- Archiving Project
  - One Drive is now used (Google Docs became cumbersome)
